PRESENTATION TYPES



Newborn Life Support (NLS) Seminar of the European Resuscitation Council (ERC) by the Hellenic Society of Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation at 7th EMA Education Conference

Aim G Educational Objectives: The World Health Organization has set as target for the decade 2020–2030, the improvement of the performance of neonatal resuscitation skills of healthcare personnel involved in perinatal care. Adverse perinatal events still remain the cause of almost one fourth of all neonatal deaths. In order to improve outcomes and reduce associated mortality and morbidity, a standardized neonatal resuscitation training program is imperative. The European Resuscitation Council Newborn Life Support provider course (ERC-NLS) by the Hellenic Society for Cardiorespiratory Resuscitation, (the only centre organizing such a course in Greece), is such a program, at providing the theoretical knowledge and technical skills for efficient and prompt intervention when a need arises.

The European Resuscitation Council Newborn Life Support Course (ERC-NLS) aims at training healthcare personnel, involved in perinatal care, in order to intervene efficiently and promptly to assist transition or resuscitate neonates at birth. Acquisition of technical skills include hands-on session on an Advanced Life Support neonatal maniquin (LAERDAL), and training in airway management, ventilation and support of circulation.

Upon completion of the Newborn Life Support (NLS) Seminar, all healthcare personnel should be able to:

- Understand the pathophysiology underling apnoea, bradycardia and poor condition at birth after hypoxic insult in newborn baby
- To anticipate which babies may have problem at birth, asses a baby at birth and recognize those who require additional help
- Have practical experience in appropriate handling of the equipment used in newborn resuscitation
- Have been taught and practiced the skills and in the case of airway and ventilation been assessed on the following skills on a manikin
 - · airway management, lung inflation and ventilation
 - directly inspect of the oropharynx using a laryngoscope
 - apply chest compressions
 - umbilical venous access



Aim G Educational Objectives: The skills of midwives in diagnosis and suturing can improve the physical and emotional well-being of the women for the rest of their lives. Blended learning strategies which include GynZones e-learning with animated videos, simulation training instructions with medical models, and surgery videos with real patients and the hands-on training on medical models improve learning outcomes and the learners self confidence. We want learners to have an adequate level of skills and competence in simulation scenarios, before suturing a living person for the first time. Learners will know how to adapt models to the requirements of increasing learning levels, from stressfree home training, to science labs, peer group work, and complex postpartum situations. SimBegin in midwifery education-an introduction to student driven simulation

Aim G Educational Objectives: Simulation has been recognized to be highly valuable in teaching and learning in nursing and midwifery education with positive outcomes for both students and patients. SimBegin is a faculty development program developed as a collaboration between SAFER simulation center and Laerdal Medical. Simulation needs planning, is challenging, and requires resources from educators. The faculty for the midwifery master program at the University in Stavanger requested SAFER's help to increase student driven learning activities and increase the use of simulation-based training in the midwifery curriculum after a presentation of the SimBegin training program. To prepare students for their first clinical placement, we have implemented a module SimBegin, a beginner level of simulation. Aim and learning objectives: The participants will be introduced to the method, viewing an introduction video, participate in simulation training in relevant midwifery cases, followed by group reflection. The debrief will follow the tool CORE (Context, Observation, Reflection, Evaluation). Finally, a film of the students' evaluations will be presented. Target population: Midwives participating at the conference


Aim & Educational Objectives: Background

There is evidence to show that the first two weeks after birth is an essential time for programming of the mammary gland.1 Early, frequent and effective breastfeeding in this time has been shown to reduce time to secretory activation and extend the duration of breastfeeding in the long term. 2, 3 It is known that lactation can be complicated by coexisting antenatal, intrapartum and postnatal risk factors, such as high pre-pregnancy body mass index and caesarean section. 4–7 Early identification of risk factors can ensure that mothers receive the support required during the vulnerable window after birth so they can achieve their long-term breastfeeding goals. Those women who need to use a breast pump to activate their milk supply should be supported to maximize the efficiency of expression from the first attempt onwards.

- Understand the importance of effective breast stimulation in the critical window after birth
- Learn about the role of vacuum and prolactin in establishing an adequate milk supply
- · Identify women 'at risk' of lactation difficulties



Aim: To introduce a tool for birth professionals and expecting parents to optimize body awareness


during pregnancy, birth, and postnatal period.

Introduction: In their paper "The relationship between mindfulness and objective measures of body awareness", Treves et al. (2019) present a person's body awareness as a central element of self-regulation and decision-making. With her antenatal preparation book and video-based e-learning course "Giving Birth Explained", author and physical therapist Antoinette El Agamy Etman takes it a step further and applies the benefits of body awareness to the whole pregnancy, birth, and afterbirth experience. According to El Agamy Etman, building body awareness allows women to recognize signals and changes in their bodies and to respond to them appropriately during pregnancy and birth. According to Da Costa Silva et al. (2022), we have made considerable progress over the past decade in understanding how the brain perceives the body. The authors describe body awareness as "the individual ability to process signals originating from within the body, which provide a mapping of the body's internal landscape (interoception) and its relationship with space and movement (proprioception)." Over 25 years ago, El Agamy Etman began to design her birth preparation method by focusing on the homunculus, in other words, by showing expecting parents how the brain and body interact during pregnancy and birth.

The book and video course "Giving Birth Explained" has been brought to thousands of women and is used by midwives and birth professionals as a tool to help visualize the birth process through body awareness. Van der Maas et al. (2012) indicate that an adaptive view defines body awareness as a process that allows a more distant and non-judgmental perception of internal body signals or as a state of embodiment in which a person integrates both the mind and body. Empowering expecting mothers with this ability allows them to better communicate their state and worries to their midwife and birthing partner during pregnancy and childbirth and helps avoid misunderstandings and, potentially, unnecessary trauma.

Educational Objectives

- To explore why body awareness is an important part of a midwife's education so that they are better prepared to teach body awareness to expecting parents and develop a shared language.
- To discover easily accessible digital e-learning tools that help teach and train body awareness.
- · To discuss why encouraging auto didactic learning in expecting parents is useful.
- To better understand the challenges in communication we face between the birth professionals and the expecting parents during pregnancy and birth.
- To discover how teaching/training body awareness creates a shared language that facilitates
- communication and prevents misunderstandings between birth professionals and expecting parents.
- To discover body awareness's role in improving communication and avoiding misunderstandings between birth professionals and expecting parents.
- To learn about body awareness by becoming aware of the role of the homunculus.
- To understand the difference between body image (outside-in) and body awareness (inside-out).
- . To uncover why body awareness is important not just before and during birth but also for the



afterbirth time.

Learning about body awareness includes learning about:

- Movement is life and change
- · That body and brain are conducted in self-rule
- The ability to visualize the birth process
- · The uterus, cervix vagina from inside out
- · Feeling that the way to the outside world is given
- · The signals given by the embryo
- · Respect and trust in the reproductive organs
- Interpreting and reacting to signals the uterus, cervix, vagina, pelvic floor and other organs are sending out
- Describing to the care person the current situation
- · The anatomical difference between the gender
- Recognizing complications after trauma/ sexual harassment
- Using communication to avoid unnecessary complications
- Body language during the afterbirth time

It presents participants with a tool for screening the current curriculum on sexuality-related topics already addressed, and it describes content for theoretical and practical lessons. It also connects content to existing international



midwifery competence profiles and provides practical guidelines for identifying suitable midwifery tutors to teach sexuality and concrete examples for building practicals concerning sexuality within midwifery contexts.



Finally, collaboration for research protocols is supported among the participating institutes. The COIL (Collaborative Online International Learning) project will also be presented. 






Shoulder dystocia workshop with high-fidelity simulation and fetal head force-monitoring. Sunday 29 October 2023 Leto 1 Hall, 10:00-11:20

Aim & Educational Objectives: Shoulder dystocia is an obstetric emergency at childbirth that can lead to significant neonatal morbidity and mortality. The aim of this workshop is to improve the knowledge and skills on shoulder dystocia management of the participating Midwives with use of high-fidelity simulation and with integrated forcemonitoring systems. A high-fidelity simulator that consists of a pelvic model and a computerized neonatal mannequin with an embedded force-monitoring system will be utilised for the purposes of shoulder dystocia management in this workshop. In specific, the high-technology simulator to be used will be the 'PROMPT Flex Birthing Simulator – Advanced, product No. 80106 (https://limbsandthings.com/uk/products/80106) as it offers the capacity for high-fidelity simulation and applied fetal head force feedback via computer software and advanced sensors. This is the simulator that is also proposed by the Royal College of Midwives and the Royal College of Obstetricians Gynaecologists in the United Kingdom and can be used both as a training and as an assessment tool. This will be a standardised 90-minute workshop with a group of 15 participants. During the 90 minutes of this workshop, there will be a 30 minute theoretical and hands-on demonstration of a shoulder dystocia scenario by the accredited instructors on the pelvic model and neonatal mannequin. For the next 60 minutes, the participants will have the chance to practice and train on the maneuvers on the high-fidelity simulator and to have immediate visual and numerical feedback of the forces they apply on the fetal head so as to acquire efficiency in head delivery and improve safety at childbirth. The primary objective of this workshop is for the participants to improve the performance of the obstetrical maneuvers needed to manage a shoulder dystocia, to make fetal head delivery safer as they master the ability to control the maximum force applied to the fetal head, to improve their communication skills and to build high levels of confidence. The high-fidelity simulator to be used in this workshop has been tested in Greek settings and has been utilised in the SAFE study, which is a research project that was funded by the Hellenic Foundation for Research and Innovation (H.F.R.I.) under the "2nd Call for H.F.R.I. Research Projects to support Post-Doctoral Researchers" (Project Number: 153; PI: D. Papoutsis). This workshop serves both training and assessment purposes and forms part of the SAFE study strategy for dissemination of its results and enhancement of its scientific and societal impact to relative stakeholders.
